Based on 2013 Medicare Claims Data, Hospice Analytics has identified **hospices exceeding the aggregate cap in 34 states.** In some states, only 1 agency is at risk of penalties to Medicare (HI, KS, MN, NY, NC, OR, TN, VA).

The highest number occurs in California, at 83, while the highest percentage is in Nevada at 39%. Of note, **87% of hospices exceeding the aggregate cap are for-profit**: 67% serving fewer than 65 patients per day and 20% serving more than 65 patients per day.

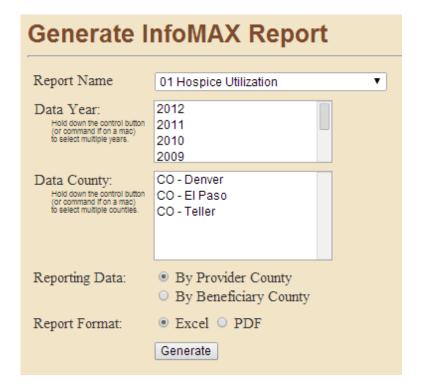

### **Opportunities and Announcements**

Physician aid-in-dying (aka "physician-assisted suicide," "physician-assisted death") bills have been introduced in Colorado, Wyoming, California, and Missouri. Another bill is in process in New Jersey. Both the AAHPM and NHPCO organizations are revising their position statements and recommendations on the issue, while numerous other medical and healthcare-related discipline associations have stated opposition or concern.

If it hasn't already, this issue will soon come to you, and every hospice professional and agency will be called upon to provide accurate information, distinguish hospice from assisted death, and reassure patients and families that relief of suffering is both our specialty and our top priority. Hospice Analytics has been following this issue very closely and has assembled copious fact-based information as well as model position statements and legislative recommendations.
